Updates

- 1. Treasurer's Report
 - Summary report provided; nothing out of the ordinary
 - Bookkeeper will provide reports very soon, as he gets up to speed
 - Decided to close the designated 'Grant Checking Account', moving funds into our other bank accounts. Funds can be readily accessed and tracked through our other accounts.
- 2. Maintenance Report
 - Fixed sink leak in bathroom, a loose shutter, and coordinated blinds order
- 3. Directors Report
 - Recent trends: computer use is up, circulation down, but foot traffic appears to be up
 - 30 new cards issued in April
 - Programs including: Mahjong, Euchre, Yoga, Seed Swap were all well-attended
 - Discussed programs designed for a specific population/audience (e.g. Alzheimer's program, Mammo van), so they should not be expected to generate the same participation as programs for a general audience
 - FLLS Outreach Mini Grant designed to put books in the hands of kids who may not have access to libraries during the summer
 - Referendum reminder postcards went to the post office on 5/8/25
 - A teen volunteer has expressed interest in providing service to the library
- 4. Friends Report
 - Plant Sale 6/13 Will sell plants grown on the property; proceeds to support garden expenses

- Friends will initiate a campaign to encourage the donation of children's books to use as prizes for summer reading
- Discussed providing education and promotion of the 'Friends' group on our social media
- Friends discussed doing a fundraiser in the fall, possibly in partnership with Donoli's
 - Discussed capacity and scale of a possible event
 - T. Savard is working with the Friends group on this

 - All quotes are fairly aligned in scope of work and price
 - Motion to move forward with D & L Construction Seamless Gutters to install pavilion gutters - J. Ward; T. Brunnabend 2nd; all voted in favor.
- 2. Gifts and Donations Policy 1st Review
 - Discussed including a recognition opportunity for a donor who gives at a specified level in the policy in the annual report, in the newsletter, and/or at the annual volunteer recognition event
 - Tabled the policy for further discussion at the June meeting
- 2. Policy "Homework" Lawyer Review
 - Trustees indicated which policies they considered important for legal review
 - Will review the list further and discuss further in June
- 3. Withdrawn and Added Titles in First Quarter
 - Reviewed list of new additions to the collection and titles that were weeded
 - Will receive a report on diversity in our collection annually
- 4. Updates on Federal Actions Impacting Libraries
 - March elimination of IMLS federal funding to libraries
 - 21 states, including NYS sued President to stop dismantling
 - On 5/6, district court judge in RI issued injunction on Executive Order
 - NY State library stable, but not the same across the country
 - Trump fired Librarian of Congress
 - As a Board, need to stay aware of the what is happening nationally and within the state, how it impacts our community, and what our role is as a Library and as the Board
